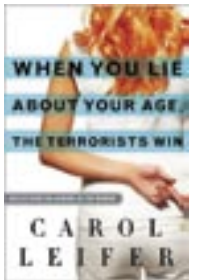

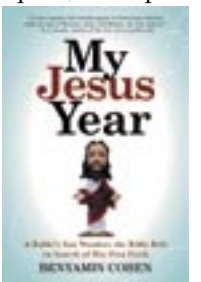
Carol Leifer came out at 40, got Bat Mitzvahed at 45, and adopted a son at 50. Now she has a new book that explains why she is just along for the ride.

A former *Seinfeld* writer, Leifer is a Jewish stand-up comedian from Long Island. She's amassed an impressive résumé producing or writing for *The Larry Sanders Show*, *Saturday Night Live*, and *The Ellen Show*. She's headlined her own HBO specials, appeared on *The Tonight Show*, *Late Night With David Letterman*, and *Politically Incorrect with Bill Maher*, and last March released her first book, *When You Lie About Your Age, the Terrorists Win*, talking about her evolution from straight to gay, being a lesbian mom, and why getting older isn't such a bad thing.

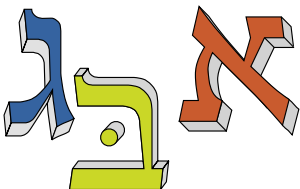
